Dennis Maes Justice Center



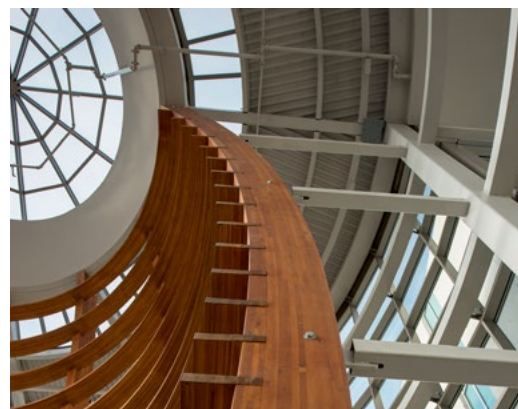

Drawing inspiration from Pueblo's history, heritage and vitality, the new Dennis Maes Justice Center masterfully fulfills Pueblo County's desire to replace an aging '60s-era courts building with an iconic new justice center that links the historic Downtown and Riverwalk Districts while improving the urban experience and reenergizing the downtown commercial district.

Designed to express the dignity of the courthouse and create a timeless feeling of strength, the highperforming building envelope features Reynobond® 4mm FR Composite Material. The architects chose Reynobond® Composite Material finished in dark paint coatings to act as an aesthetic massing element on the façade, and used blue glass and earth-tone cladding materials to mirror the color palette of the community's surrounding landscape.

A segmented, radiused rainscreen wall at the roof level, clad in Reynobond® Composite Material, runs almost the entire length of the building to visually tie in to the six-story end of the structure. The entry wall and vestibule, also clad in Reynobond® Composite Material and accented with a canopy of opaque glass, provide a striking entry portal into the building.
